The Sanford Unitarian Universalist Church building has stood on this corner in the center of Sanford since its dedication in November 1918, just before the armistice ending WW I. This winter we're shoring up the trusses supporting the roof over the Sanctuary to secure it for another century of service to the congregation and the larger community. Then we'll insulate the top and sides of the building. Work began earlier this month and should be completed early in the new year. We'll paint the exterior trim in the Spring, long-delayed maintenance. ### **Common Good Reminder**




