

They will insulate the cap over the Sanctuary late this week. Insulation of the Sanctuary walls will follow. Assessment of the Church tower structure will be completed by our engineer this month. This assessment is supported by the Maine Community Foundation's Steeples Fund. The external trim will be painted this Spring.
