Shay's Sharing...

It's Spring!

Well...kind of.

I'm writing this from our sunroom, where, with a small space heater, it's finally warm enough to sit again. It's the Spring Equinox, a balanced day of light and night, and I'm watching a super moon rise in the dusky sky.

I've been reading *The Island Within* by Richard Nelson – a beautiful book filled with lyrical prose and spiritual depth as he realizes over and over again that the breadth and depth of Nature is something to be respected, experienced, protected, and revered.

"Throughout this vast expanse the land breathes with song and pours an anthem of morning into the sky. In the glow of a summer sunrise, the living continent sings."

The world is reawakening, however slowly, blooming and blossoming everywhere around us. Look closely and you will see the signs.

For many of us, I imagine the world within is reawakening as well, after a long, gray winter. When I first came here in August and had grand visions of all the things we would get done, people warned me that life slows down in the winter months. Now I know this to be true!

And it's time for us to move out of hibernation. There is work to be done in this beautiful, brilliant world – songs to be heard and songs to be sung.

"It matters not what the clocks say or the attitudes and labors of men. Morning is when I am awake and there is a dawn in me. To affect the quality of the day, that is the highest of arts. Every man is tasked to make his life, even in its details, worthy of the contemplation of his most elevated and critical hour. If we refused, or rather used up, such paltry information as we get, the oracles would distinctly inform us how this might be done." ~ Henry David Thoreau from Walden

My friends, let there be a dawn in you! Throw off sleep and jump willingly into the unfamiliar and the unknown. Affect the quality of your days with wonder and awe through conscious endeavor. Carve and paint yourselves anew into a wakefulness that sees this world the way we dream it to be - a wakefulness that inspires you to work toward creating that world unfailingly.

Covenant of Right Relations Team Update

Our CRR team will make our proposed covenant available in early April. The following may be helpful in putting our work in context both as we ask the congregation to affirm our covenant at our Annual Meeting and as we move forward.

Joe Sullivan, Congregational Consultant to New England Region UUA, writes in the March Newsletter *Spiritual Leadership Practices, Part 4: Choosing Mutuality – The Promise & Practice of Covenant:*

"In yearning for a better world we too often neglect the ancient practice that is central to our UU faith - **covenanting** - the religious discipline intended to help us actualize and sustain our will to mutuality. Covenanting is our renewing practice of solemn promises of mutual support and commitment, of mutual fidelity to shared high purpose, and to something greater than ourselves. . . . Covenanting depends not on piousness or enforced consequences. Rather it depends upon humility, love, grace, trust, compassion, mercy. It is inherently forgiving, and when violated (more commonly by neglect than by misbehavior), it seeks restoration and renewal.

How do we really practice covenant? First and foremost we do so by showing up for one another in spirit and body. . . . We practice it in authentic mutual relationship with marginalized communities and willingness to follow their lead; and when, as Bryan Stevenson suggests, we "get proximate" to suffering.

We can tell the practice of covenant is truly alive when we see:

- people intentionally putting themselves in uncomfortable, vulnerable encounters, and staying at the table when the going is hard in order to forge or sustain relationship;
- ongoing faithful risking and tolerance for failure in the cause of advancing shared purpose;
- norms, traditions, and expectations intentionally altered in order to be truly welcoming to all, especially those marginalized in our communities.

When freely entered and actualized by the people, our Unitarian Universalist core religious practice of covenant is there to undergird expansive, life transforming mutuality. What if we committed to practicing covenant as if the wellbeing of our congregations, our faith, our lives and hopes depended upon it? They do."

SUUC Book Group

The SUUC Book Group will meet next on Friday April 19th at 6:00pm in Goodall Hall to discuss: *Spiritual Science: Why Science Needs Spirituality to Make Sense of the World* (2018) by Steve Taylor.

Is it possible that the biggest mysteries in the world can be solved not through science or spirituality alone, but through an approach that combines them both?

In this groundbreaking book, Steve Taylor offers a new vision of the world that is compatible with both modern science and ancient spiritual teachings. *Spiritual Science* reveals Taylor's "panspiritist" view of reality, one that transcends both conventional science and religion, and answers many of the riddles that neither can fully explain. The standard model of science has had limited success in explaining many phenomena, including human consciousness, the connection between the mind and the body, altruism and "anomalous" phenomena such as near-death experiences, psi phenomena and spiritual experiences, to name just a few. But from a "panspiritist" perspective – which sees spirit or consciousness as a fundamental essence of reality – it is possible to make sense of all these things.

Drawing on the insights of philosophers, physicists, mystics, as well as spiritual traditions and indigenous cultures, Steve Taylor makes a compelling case for a spiritual vision of reality. He presents a worldview that is compatible with both modern science and ancient spiritual teachings – a vision of a sacred and interconnected world, and of a meaningful and purposeful human life.
