Shay's Sharing...

"God of many names and mystery beyond all our naming," begins a prayer by UU minister Rev. Daniel Kanter. Muslims sing the 99 names of Allah, believing them to be outward signs of the universe's inner mysteries. In Judaism, names convey the nature and essence of things, represent the history and reputation of what they name, and therefore, G-d's names in all of their forms are treated with great respect and reverence. The Christian God is infinite and incomprehensible and so metaphors, given in divine revelation, are used to name that God, allowing God to be revealed to humans in finite and comprehensible ways. And as we explore the many beautiful and mysterious deities of paganism and earth-centered traditions this month, let us remember that no name for the Holy is any more or less sacred than any other.

I read somewhere once that for Unitarian Universalists, the names we use for the sacred and holy represent the vision of our highest values and hopes. If this is true, then regardless of whether you believe in an actual deity (or several), regardless of whether you believe in an interested God or no God, regardless of what you believe about something or someone larger than us moving throughout all of creation – if this is true, then when we say "God," deep down, beneath all metaphor, we are naming the same thing.

What would our song of the names of God sound like?

Adolfo Quezada writes, "God of the Wild, you are different from what I expected. I cannot predict you. You are too free to be captured for the sake of my understanding. You are everywhere I least expect to find you."

Let us explore the ancient and powerful Names of this wild, unpredictable thing that is hidden in all of our secret places. Let us reclaim these words that may have alienated us, wounded us, distanced us from each other and ourselves. Let us reclaim and redefine the All Things and the Nothing that God represents. Let us sing together the many names of that which we hold sacred .

Corner Cupboarding in November

On November 16, Corner Cupboard volunteers (aged 13 to 80+) provided free non-food essentials to people from 131 households (including 14 new ones). Shoppers chose personal health, cleaning, paper, pet, baby, and other necessary products. They also selected from donated clothing, books, and miscellaneous items before moving on to dinner in the parlor. Clients included a woman who said she comes to Corner Cupboard whenever she is well enough to get there and another who was a little later than usual because she had been collecting a big bagful of discarded cans and bottles along the way. People who shop here tell us they need the Corner Cupboard and count on it. Simultaneously, the energetic and talented Project CommUnity team hosted a complete Harvest Dinner at Sanford UU Church. Locally grown produce, home cooking, and dinner and to-go meals succeeded again in building community through the caring connections between enthusiastic volunteers and well over 100 dinner guests. A Sanford High School scholar named Aiden volunteers at Corner Cupboard every month to register shoppers as they enter Goodall Hall. He says that it "Feels good to make a difference." When asked how it is working with a team that includes a number of volunteers more than a few decades older than he is, he smiled and said, "It's like I'm in the 1980s."

Quiet Social Time

Scott Knight will be leading a group where people can come together and have some low-pressure social activity. The group would start with quiet conversation while people arrive (not too loud, he wants this to be a safe space for people with sensory issues). He would then do a signal of some sort and the group would all sit and do an hour of silent activity of choice (bring a book to read, craft, journal, coloring, anything that can be done silently). At the end of the hour another signal of sorts will play and the group will come together in a circle to share anything they would



like. No one would have to share, but the space will be there for people who are excited about their activity and want to. This group is open to anyone, in or out of this church, who would benefit from silent social activity. The group will meet on Thursdays through the end of June 2020, in Rev. Shay's office from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. If you are interested, please contact the church office at 324-3191.

Notes from the Board

The Board gathered in Shay's office in November. We were happy to have the furnace working again as the night was cold and rainy. With a new, reduced meeting time in practice, we set out to begin promptly and communicate effectively through our agenda.

Some important items of business were on the list this month! Marcel let us know that more work is needed to truly "fix" the furnace. We learned that several people, including Bill and some repair folks, were working on days off to get heat into the sanctuary. We are so grateful for their dedication!

I was able to report the data collected for the wayside pulpit. Thirty-four surveys were collected! Thank you for sharing your thoughts and feelings! The results have been narrowed to the top 8 phrases that got the most votes from the congregation. We are happy to keep momentum going on this project which will help make our values as a congregation transparent to the broader community. Next will be design work and then installing the new banner!

Diane attended an AED training in early November and reported back to us what she'd learned! The training was helpful and gave us a lot of necessary info to move forward including how to keep the AED machine in top working order, how best to store it and other important items to have on hand in case of a medical emergency. In addition to moving forward with the installation of the AED in the church, we are also planning to keep making progress with other safety measures for the building and community of folks that use it.

An organizational plan was made for any snow day closures that may need to be called in the months ahead. Shay let us know that if she is scheduled to preach and service is cancelled at the church, she will be delivering her sermon from home! She will provide us with a way to watch the sermon from a home computer (if you have one), safely and soundly.

The Board continues to feel concern for the rising homeless population in town and are actively seeking ways to better serve this communities needs with our resources, building, time and energy. While the task seems daunting, we feel there is an abundance of momentum and heart behind this work both within our congregation and across the faith communities here in Sanford and neighboring towns.

There's always so much to discuss at these meetings, it is hard to convey all of it! I'd like to close by giving my personal remarks as the newest member of the Board. In the short time that I have served with this group of folks I have been truly moved by the care, commitment, intelligence and support that flows through these meetings. It's an honor to serve on the Board of this congregation and I look forward to continuing to grow and learn through this experience!
