

Board of Management Structure DRAFT 2/20/2020

This year (2019-2020) the Board of Management has worked without a President and with a 7-person Board. We wanted to provide some observations about how it has gone and describe plans for moving forward, some of which will require congregational approval both this year and in 2021.

The year has gone well. We have rotated responsibilities for chairing the Board meetings and providing monthly updates to the congregation. Previously, the President met with the Minister, set the agenda, ran the Board meetings, and informed the congregation. This year, every month a different person meets with Shay, sets the agenda, and runs the meetings. Each chair has a different style but never feels like "the boss." In addition, by no longer using Robert's Rules of Order, our Board meetings are half an hour shorter (6:30 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. instead of 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.). We no longer waste time on motions, 1st, 2nd, and votes and, instead, focus on questions, concerns, and problems.

When we reviewed nonprofit Board governance models, we found the following best describes our current approach:

A Board that operates without a CEO uses a Cooperative Model. The Board makes consensual decisions as a group of peers, making it the most democratic governance model. There is no hierarchy and no one individual has power over another. The Board exists only because the law requires its formation. This model requires that each member be equally committed to the organization and willing to take responsibility for the actions of the whole Board.

This affects our experience at meetings. Each of us is an active participant in discussions. We work in small subcommittees when they make more sense and work with one another by email between meetings. The clerk distributes minutes by email within a week or two of a meeting; the feedback to the clerk informs the minutes presented at the next meeting. This step alone means that each of us is responsible for not letting things slip through the cracks, ensuring that what we have addressed is documented in the minutes and, if we did not resolve a question, it comes back onto the agenda.

One of our obligations under the By-Laws is to review the By-Laws every three years. In conducting that review, we have identified a number of changes we will move forward with next year. This spring, however, we need to assist the Nominating Committee with its work. As a result, we are going to propose the following:

Next year we will operate, as this year, without a President, as a 7-person Board. We feel that the 7-person Board is consistent with our congregation's size.

Next year is Karen's last year as Vice President. Our recommendation in the By-Laws revision will be that the Board thereafter be comprised of seven members: Clerk, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, three Liaisons, and an At-Large Member.

We are carefully reviewing the By-Laws and the Handbook of Operations to devise By-Laws that accurately describe how we work as a Board while being responsive to congregational needs. As we move forward, if you have any questions or concerns, feel free to ask any member of the Board of Management: Karen Nelson (Vice President), Janie Waterhouse (Clerk), Marcel Gagnon (Treasurer), Ginny Howe (Financial Secretary), Natasha Nolan (Liaison), Judi Reis (Liaison), and Diane Whiteside-Peck (Liaison).

Stewardship Update

As of March 30, 2020, we have received 14 pledges for a total of \$31,570.00. Thank you!

Pledges this year are about half of last year's pledges, and 47% (based on preliminary pledge goal of \$66,986.00) of our targeted goal for fiscal 2020-2021. We are \$35,416.00 short of that figure.

The Board and Finance Committee will be working to do the best we can under the current circumstances.

Although March 31st is the official end of pledge month, we will gladly accept additional pledges. We will keep the congregation informed as we go forward.

Church Building Update

During this difficult time for everyone, we want to assure you all that the church remains watched over and cared for. Bill and I continue to work our normal hours, Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 7:00 a.m. to noon.

Bill was completely disinfecting every handle, light switch, door knob, and touch point daily until <u>all</u> of the outside meetings and gatherings were cancelled. We are the only two people coming to church on a regular basis now. Bill continues to check every room of the building upon entry and disinfects as needed.

The outside light by the ramp, in-between Goodall Hall and the Parlor, is left on in the evening. We turn it off when we arrive and turn it on when we leave. Until our electrician is able to come in and install a motion sensor light, we are hoping this will help deter a burglary. To put everyone's mind at ease, the church is occupied and kept up and cared for as it has been all along.

Below is a list of extra jobs Bill has been working on and hopes to complete as time allows during the closure of the church.

- Check, repair and clean every blue/silver metal chair
- Paint wall by the pegboard on the ride side of entry door to parlor
- Thoroughly clean and disinfect all tables
- Paint top of radiators in the parlor
- Sand and refinish the top of the altar
- Paint the bottom trim in the main entry
- Reset the nails in the floor of Goodall Hall
- Wash the floor in Goodall Hall
- Use a sealer on entire Goodall Hall floor
- Paint bottom of doors, inside bottom of sill and ramp entry
- Paint entry door to parlor
- Paint door trims
- Paint left side of minister's door
- Refinish the long wooden bench in Goodall Hall entry
- Paint the lower right hand side of the wall in the church entry
- Paint baseboards in Goodall Hall
- Paint the window in the church entry
- Repair the white fence along Lebanon Street
- Repaint the padded bench in Goodall Hall

- Shaws: Every Tuesday and Thursday from 7:00 - 9:00 a.m. Shaws will set aside shopping time specifically for senior citizens and other at-risk members of our community. - Market Basket: Will be open each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 5:30 to 7:00 a.m. ONLY to serve customers 60 and older. - Wal-Mart: From March 24 through April 28, Wal-Mart stores will host an hour-long senior shopping event every Tuesday for customers aged 60 and older. This will start one hour before the store opens. - Target: All nationwide stores will reserve the first hour of shopping each Wednesday at stores nationwide for vulnerable guests. - Hannaford will be dedicating special shopping hours for customers over 60 and those with compromised immune systems starting March 24. Stores will open early from 6:00 - 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.
