Shay's Sharing...



Dear friends,

I know this is scary. I know things are hard to understand and even harder to imagine going on for an unforeseeable amount of time.

I also know that UUCSB, SUUC and their people have been through some really tough times before. And I know that we have to trust ourselves, that we have to trust in our strength and the combined strength of these communities, to stay together during these tough times, to not turn away or run away or withdraw into distressed isolation, but to stay and stand and survive. I know these congregations must survive! The world needs us - and we need each other.

And we can't survive if we don't have tough conversations about how to do that, in these ever-changing times, in these strange and unfamiliar landscapes, in these terrifying situations that are forcing us into making decisions we don't want to have to make.

I understand the desire to comfort and soothe rather than agitate. We certainly are called to be healers and peacemakers. AND we are called to be prophetic, to acknowledge that we are all interconnected, that we need each other to thrive, and that the world needs us to be brave - for ourselves, for each other, and for the future of everyone and everything we hold dear.

I believe that we ALL need to be invited into reflection, that we need to be heard, we all need to be reminded that each one of us is important to this community, that every single person matters in who and what we are, and that ALL of us are part of leading these two churches into the future.

I am truly sorry that what is being said by health professionals, government officials, and the UUA leadership is hard to hear. I am truly sorry if, two years into this ministry we're not where you hoped we would be. I'm truly sorry we are living through a global pandemic while in the bowels of an awful presidency and that it looks like we will continue living this way for many months.

I'm scared and depressed and struggling with apathy, too. I'm feeling inadequate and incapable of living up to what I think YOU need. And I have to keep reminding myself that I don't actually know what any of you need until I ask you. I also don't have to be strong and brave enough for all of us. We can be strong and brave together. Perhaps giving all of us that purpose will help more than anything else. We need each other.

And I need all of us to have faith. That is, after all, what we're all about. I need all of us to have faith in the promises that bind us and the love that sustains us.

I am grateful for your compassion and concern for each other. I'm grateful for your thoughtfulness and caution around how to keep our communities safe and connected. I'm grateful for your dedication to these churches and this shared ministry. And I'm grateful for you, just you, each of you, and all you bring, all you give, all that you are.

As we continue moving through this time and having to make difficult decisions (and exciting ones!), whatever those may be, your Boards and I will be asking for you to stand with us, to offer support and guidance – for we cannot fulfill our promises to "lead in service to the will of our people" if we do not know your will! Keep showing up, keep speaking out, keep loving these churches and supporting the work that we do. Mostly, just keep being you.

From the Board

We "zoomed" our Board Meeting on May 11. We are getting good at this, which is fortunate since there is no solid information about when we will be able to gather again at church. The UUA is still recommending against in person services and we are following those recommendations.



This year we'll have our Annual Meeting remotely too. On June 14, at 11:15, after the worship service, we will meet via Zoom and the phone to make decisions about our church for the '20 - '21 church year. The Warrant is included in another part of this newsletter, please check it out. Rev. Shay sends out a phone number as well as a Zoom link days before Sunday, so we can all be ready to come to the meeting.

Covid 19 really has shaken up things everywhere. The only thing we know for sure is that everything is in flux. This uncertainty is reflected in our the new budget. Because no one is at church, we have not been spending as much for utilities, sewer and water, etc. but we've also been losing revenue from rentals and fundraisers. The new budget is based on pledges of \$53,569. That is very good, especially considering the circumstances of everyone's lives right now. Although the stewardship campaign is officially over, new pledges are still welcome.

The Summer Services will not be held at church, because of safety concerns. However, there are plans in the works for ways for us to share pre-recorded stories, meditations, reflections, etc. More information will follow.

One last thing that is pretty awesome. While the Corner Cupboard is not able to distribute non-food items from church, it is still active. The CC has been partnering with other organizations to get supplies to people in need. They have worked with Meals on Wheels and the Backpack Program. We all know about shortages of toilet paper and cleaning supplies. These shortages make it impossible for the CC to order large supplies of the things given out every month. But as long as there are things to give away, the Corner Cupboard will continue to help.

Sanford UU Church COVID Relief Fund

A few weeks ago, our church received a donation in the amount of \$100,000, specifically directed at easing financial burdens created by the Covid-19 crisis in the Sanford-Springvale community. The Board of Management met to discuss what to do next, and Shay and Marcel helped create an account for the funds.

Also, a coordinating team has been established. Members of the SUUC Covid Relief Fund team are Pat Herrick, Lee Burnett, Natasha Nolan, and Diane Whiteside-Peck. We met online on Monday, May 25. Our mission is to disburse the funds to community groups, and perhaps individuals, with needs created by the virus. Each of us, this week, is to contact groups who are currently working with people in the community affected by the pandemic: Pat will talk to YCCAC and Project CommUnity with Natasha; Lee will ask local farmers how we can coordinate with them; Diane will call Meals on Wheels. We also generated a few, brief questions to be answered by groups applying for the funds.

Our team decided to "Zoom meet" each Monday evening at 7 o'clock, and to communicate through emails during the week, to continue our mission. We are looking for one or two other people to join the team. If you are interested, please let one of us know as soon as possible! We welcome your joining us, whether as part of the actual team, as a volunteer to help in distribution of possible meals or other tangible needs, or to share your knowledge and ideas that will further our mission.

June 2020 FiAT - MUUSAN News!


MUUSAN and the UUA - UU the Vote are reminding us all to either request an absentee ballot to vote by mail or to safely vote in person in the Maine Primary on July 14th. They are encouraging us to learn about all the candidates and their position on the issues that are important to us all as Unitarian Universalist and then vote accordingly. As a church, we can NOT tell you who to vote for or against but we can educate ourselves and others about the issues important to us and how each candidate feels about them or what they plan to do if elected. We have been asked to help people register to vote and then to help them requesting a ballot by mail or in getting safely to the polls on election day. I will add that we need to contact our Senators and Representatives in DC and tell them to financially support the USPS (United States Postal Service) with COVID 19 relief money. Phone Calls work best! The USPS is in trouble and we need them to be able to vote absentee. During the Pandemic it is critical that we are able to vote by mail and in person safely.

Other ways you can UU the Vote is to join other like minded local groups doing social justice work in Augusta. The one I joined in 2012 is the Maine Peoples' Alliance (MPA). MPA moved all its resources from lobbying to set up the MainersTogether.com website in response to the COVID 19 Pandemic. Anyone wishing to join Mainers Together helping people in need or advocating for policies (usually supported by MUUSAN, too) that help low income Mainers and people affected by the Pandemic, you can sign up on the website or contact me for more info.

SUUC's FiAT has been very busy responding to the needs of the people in the Greater Sanford Area brought on by the COVID 19 Pandemic. We have coordinated efforts with Mainers Together – MPA and our own Corner Cupboard, the local food pantries and the Sanford Backpack Program to bring groceries, supplies, medications and Hope to the people in need. The extent of poverty and how many people are just a \$1,000 emergency away from it has been exposed by this pandemic. Most people don't have the recommended 3 to 6 months of income in a rainy day savings account waiting for a Pandemic to take their job away.

Your FiAT has answered the call from a distant UU to check on their UU friend at a Sanford assisted living facility. We have gone shopping and delivered the groceries to her as needed and she is very grateful to our church for helping her stay safe.
