FiAT News - Ways We can put our Faith into Action!

Remember to Vote in the Maine Primary on July 14th, 2020! You can request your Maine Absentee Ballot at: https://www.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl. I am unsure about other towns but Sanford City Hall is open and you can vote in person during their business hours. If you know anyone who needs help to register to vote, they can call their local town hall for assistance or visit mejp.org or lwvme.org has helpful links.

Our sister church, UUCSB, is holding a BLM vigil protest every Wednesday from 5-6:00pm on the Elm St. Bridge, which is at the intersection of Water St. and Elm St. (RT. 1) in Saco. They park on Water St. in the parking lot closest to the bridge. They wear masks and observe six feet of social distancing, have a banner, and carry signs. They have only about a dozen people at present but they want to grow. They would love to have us join them.

Mass Poor People's Assembly and Moral March on Washington Digital Gathering happened Saturday, June 20th. The event was recorded and you can watch it online at "www.june2020.org". They are working with more than 200 partner organizations across the country, including unions, religious denominations (including UU), and social and environmental justice organizations to ensure that their message is heard far and wide: "Somebody's been hurting our people, and it's gone on for far too long. And WE WON'T BE SILENT ANYMORE!"

The Women's March in support of BLM sent this message to me.

One of the officers who murdered Breonna Taylor was fired from the force on Friday. This is a step in the right direction, but we know this is not what justice looks like and we refuse to settle for it.

There are still two other officers, Jonathan Mattingly and Myles Cosgrove, on the force who were involved in Breonna's murder. Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer must fire ALL of them.

Over 600 of you made calls last week directly to Mayor Fischer and many of you reported that the voice-mail inboxes were full. That's why instead we're asking everyone to send a personal email to Mayor Fischer today. Greg.fischer@louisvilleky.gov

In a joint statement, the attorneys representing Breonna's family said this news is a welcome, but long-overdue step toward justice. It's been 101 days since Bre's murder. The attorneys said, "we await further action by the police department to terminate the other officers," and that it is time for Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron to file criminal charges against all the officers. We cannot rest. Every message sent shows that we're watching and sends the message that anything less than justice will not be tolerated.

Covid-19 Relief Fund Created

The SUUC Covid Relief Team has been meeting weekly to help relieve hardships created by the coronavirus pandemic.

The team was created to manage a fund established by church members Art and Celina Dumas to address basic human needs created or made worse by the pandemic. The group has created a simple request form that was distributed to the community and is working to establish a dedicated account with Fidelity Investments. (The logistical details are still being finalized as of this writing.)

The team has made three awards. Recipients have been notified that disbursements will be made as soon as the account is established. Awards to date:

\$500 to Project CommUnity to support a black-owned business adversely affected by pandemic. The money bought take-out meals from One Love restaurant for organizers and participants of the Black Lives Matter rally in Sanford on June 6.

\$5,000 to Maine Access Points to support front line workers in opiate addiction, whose jobs are made more difficult and risky by the pandemic. The money buys personal protective equipment, mileage reimbursement and stipends for outreach efforts.

\$10,000 to York County Community Action Corp. to support families facing financial hardships as a result of the pandemic. The money will go entirely toward cash dispersements, spent at the discretion of Community Action, to supplement other relief payments that may be insufficient in certain circumstances.
