A couple of years ago, I was fortunate enough to be able to visit Hawaii with my family. On a morning outing to see Waimea Falls, as we walked through the park, an older Hawaiian woman called us over



to a small table sitting in the shade of a pop-up tent. Laid on the table before her were various items native to the local culture. She saw me looking at a small flute and picked it up, telling me that it was, "a Hawaiian nose flute."

I had never heard of such a thing – playing a musical instrument with your nose!?! My surprise must have shown on my face, for she lifted the flute to her face and played a short tune for us.

"Do you know why we play the flute with our noses?" she asked me.

"Our mouths talk. Out of them come all sorts of meanness and nasties, sometimes without even thinking, and then they can't be taken back. They settle, here, in the heart, hurting, an open wound, forever out there, hurting."

"With the pureness of our breath," she continued, "we can soothe, heal, create beauty and put it out into the world."

I asked, "Can you play and sing at the same time?"



Update From Your Board of Management



As you know, the Board continues its monthly meetings via Zoom. At our December 12th meeting, we spent time discussing and then approving the changes to our church Bylaws, necessitated by last year's decision not to continue with either a church President or Vice-President. You will soon receive an email with the new wording of the proposed changes. Please read it carefully, since all members will be asked to vote on the changes at a Special Meeting on January 31st!

Marcel reported that we are financially healthy, except that Pledge donations from members and friends stand at 39% fulfilled; because December marks the midway point in the church's Fiscal Year, that is a bit low, but understandable in these rough times. The good news is that Trust Fund earnings are \$5,000 above predicted amounts. We also continue to pay our entire staff the wages they were promised in the 2020-2021 Budget!

Also on the agenda was the Board's scheduled reevaluation of whether to resume in-person Sunday services, and it was decided to remain on Zoom for the rest of the year for the safety of our congregation.

Two noteworthy Giving Opportunities exist within our church, if you are able to help in any way. The first is a Furnace Replacement Fund. Our good old oil-burning furnace is getting up in years, and will definitely need replacing as soon as possible. Second is the Covid Relief Fund, whose original donor has requested additional donations from congregants able and willing to add to the Fund. After helping many individuals and groups who were impacted by the corona virus pandemic, the account stands at \$31,000 currently.

Finally, please consider volunteering to head our Annual Budget Drive for 2021-2022, which traditionally begins in February and ends in March. This one-time job involves creating a theme for the Drive, writing a newsletter article and upbeat reminders for Friday emails, composing an Appeal Letter to congregants, tallying the pledges as Mona receives them, giving the congregation progress reports, and rounding up a group to help write Thank-You notes to anyone who pledged. Thanks for considering this volunteer opportunity!

This Christmas season was especially stressful for families facing hardships brought on by the Covid-19 pandemic. Six families struggling with unpaid bills sought help from the SUUC Covid Relief Team during December. A total of \$7,966 was disbursed to catch families up on CMP bills, mortgage payments, home repair bills, rent payments, and storage unit rent.

The plight of these families moves us all. Many are truly desperate and still struggle with asking for help.

Our little team meets weekly by Zoom. Sometimes we make decisions by email, when needs are pressing. We strive to be as responsive as possible and treat all with dignity.

It's been a tough year in so many ways. But even in our disconnected state when so much has been suspended, the work goes on. Church members should feel proud that the church is making a real difference.

Stuff the Bus

This year's Stuff the Bus Maine's campaign, was profoundly affected by Covid. We could not hold our supply donation drives at Wal-Mart, which accounted for 90 percent of our programs supplies collection, which we use to help an estimated 4,000 York County students. We were essentially dead-in the water. I was contacted by Strategies for a Stronger Sanford program, and encouraged to apply for a grant thru the Sanford Unitarian churches, Covid 19 relief fund. This fund was created to help organizations like mine whose important work, was deeply affected by the Global Pandemic. As a result of this Stuff the Bus Maine received a grant for 10,000 dollars. This was the beginning of something magical and a game changer for my program. We went from not planning to do anything to handing out over 400 backpacks, so far. We also purchased Ukuleles for an entire 4th grade music class, whom because of Covid can't do recorders or Chorus this year. We are deeply grateful to the Sanford Unitarian Church for their generosity, and have chosen them as the recipient of the, 2020 Stuff the Bus award! Congratulations, we can never express how much this gift has meant to our program and the children and teachers we help! It was the beginning of us raising \$22,474 so far this year which is amazing, we come from a caring and strong community, that rises above even the challenges of a global Pandemic.



Corner Cupboard Update

The CC has been distributing items through a number of avenues, despite having its doors closed on the 3rd Saturday of each month. Items were donated to the Meals on Wheels program in southern York County. The SCAE complete pantry receives deliveries of non-food items as needed. The Sanford trash bag distribution got the RE kids involved. Unfortunately only about 10 packs were given out. The rest will be distributed in other ways. Personal care items were delivered to The Salvation Army for the teens who receive holiday stockings. We also continue to receive and deliver individual orders by CC clients, or those referred to us by case workers, social workers, or general assistance directors. - Judi Reis








Announcing a Mini Fundraiser!

The Book Group will meet by Zoom on Friday, January 8, 2021 at 4:30 p.m. Karen Nelson will lead the meeting. We will discuss *Snow Falling on Cedars* by David Guterson.

Gripping, tragic, and densely atmospheric- a masterpiece of suspense. San Piedro Island, north of Puget Sound, is a place so isolated that no one who lives there can afford to make enemies. But in 1954 a local fisherman is found suspiciously drowned, and a Japanese American named Kabuo Miyamoto is charged with his murder. In the course of the ensuing trial, it becomes clear that what is at stake is more than a man's guilt. For on San Pedro, memories of a charmed love affair between a white boy and the Japanese girl who grew up to become Kabuo's wife; memories of land desired, paid for, and lost. Above all, San Piedro is haunted by the memory of what happened to its Japanese residents during World War II, when an entire community was sent into exile while its neighbors watched.
