Heating Source Update

The Building & Grounds Committee reviewed proposals from Jeremy (the ongoing furnace maintenance man) and Revision Energy (the company that installed the solar panels). Both proposals recommend installing heat pumps, a more eco-friendly alternative to the use of fossil fuels which will also reap significant future savings. The Committee recommends contracting with Revision Energy (which presented an "all costs included" proposal) to install heat pumps throughout the church building.

We need an additional \$31,000 for this project. So far \$11,000 has been pledged (including a \$10,000 donation from congregation member(s) to an eco-friendly alternative to fossil fuels); \$20,000 - \$25,000 is the sum we need to fund.

Donations to "<u>SUUC – Heating Source"</u> will help bridge the gap!

The Finance Committee approved a loan from trust funds; that loan will be repaid through planned budget allocation starting next year. To be continued.......

After 18 ½ years of working at the SUUC, Bill and I are looking forward to our retirement. This was a tough decision to make as it has truly been a joy working at the church. Thank you for the wealth of information, support and love so many of you have provided. We will hold close to our hearts all of the many relationships we have developed within our church family over the past years. Relief Committee Update



The Covid Relief Fund team met on June 3rd via Zoom. There were no new requests to discuss, but we were again concerned about how to help those who have no permanent homes. Although this is not our mandate, Lee said he would ask City Hall whether it is at all possible to convert part of our church into a temporary housing apartment. SUUC's Board of Management investigated this idea years ago but were unable to meet the stringent requirements for such housing (i.e. private shower room, kitchen, and so forth). The CRF team agreed to not meet over the summer months unless a request came to our attention. Please be on the alert for anyone or any group who may need funds due to Covid 19 hardship; \$15,000 remains in the account.

Annual Meeting, Flower Communion and Final Service with Rev. Shay

On Sunday, June 13, 2021, members of the Sanford Unitarian Universalist Church gathered in person with one another, for the first time in fourteen months. The Parker-Nolan's grassy yard was our Sanctuary, and overhead was a dome of mature oaks and pines and blue sky. We hugged hello to one another, heard UU hymns and tunes sung by the Bi-Choir – including several members of the UUCSB church – who have graced us with music in unbelievable virtual form all year, swayed to an amazingly sweet harp piece by Melody, held our Flower Communion together, and toward the end, said good-bye to Reverend Shay MacKay. We welcomed Georgia and Charlie as new members and celebrated the work of those leaving the Board.

When the service ended, a short break was called before our Annual Meeting began. Twenty-two members voted to accept the Annual Reports, the budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, the dissolution of Reverend MacKay's contract, and the induction onto the Board of Jan and Lisa as Members-At-Large and Charlie as Liaison. Kael was voted onto the Nominating Committee.

The peace and happiness which the outdoor ceremonies and cheerful conversation created in this church family, despite sad feelings of losing our minister, only served to strengthen our resolve to support one another: as the Worship Associates again delight us with sermons twice a month and visiting ministers are invited for the remaining Sundays; as we seek replacements for the irreplaceable Mona and Bill; as we rely on tech-savvy members to increase our WiFi signals and support our virtual services in the hybrid manner we plan to provide once the building reopens; as we help temporarily in the office and plan summer services; and as we emerge from isolation and stay humble and forgiving of one another, ever mindful of the spirit of this church, which is Love, and its expression through our Covenant of Right Relations.



Sanford UU Church Book Group

The Book Group will be meeting on Thursdays in the Fall of 2021, beginning September 9 (Thursday) at 4:30 with *The Deepest Well: Healing the Long-term Effects of Childhood Adversity* by Nadine Burke Harris MD.

Dr. Nadine Burke Harris was already known as a crusading physician delivering targeted care to vulnerable children. But it was Diego - a boy who had stopped growing after a sexual assault - who galvanized her journey to uncover the connections between toxic stress and lifelong illnesses. The stunning news of Burke Harris's research is just how deeply our bodies can be imprinted by ACEs - adverse childhood experiences like abuse, neglect, parental addiction, mental illness, and divorce. Childhood adversity changes our biological systems, and lasts a lifetime. For anyone who has faced a difficult childhood, or who cares about the millions of children who do, the fascinating scientific insight and innovative, acclaimed health interventions in *The Deepest Well* represent vitally important hope for preventing lifelong illness for those we love and for generations to come.



Dear Congregants and friends of the SUUC,

This month the Board meeting was held in person, outdoors. There was a full agenda as there are many changes upon us! Hiring for the positions of Admin Asst. and Facilities Manager was at the top of the list as Mona and Bill start their retirement at the end this week! We talked at length about job descriptions, compensation and how to go about advertising the positions.

Additionally the Board has been working to expand the Wi-Fi service in the church for better bandwidth throughout the building, especially in the sanctuary. This will be vital for the hybrid model we hope to offer when we are meeting again in person. (Hybrid model means that services, held in person, will also be live streamed through Zoom to anyone who cannot make it in to church!) Paul Poyant has done significant research on this matter and has ordered the necessary equipment and will also install it for us! Thank you, Paul!

As this was Shay's last meeting with us she helped us hone in on some of the things we might need to keep in our sights. It is clear that Board members will be wearing many hats over the year ahead including making decisions about when to resume in person services, how to continue to keep our community healthy and safe, ensuring a rich and diverse line up of guest ministers and lay-led services, reestablishing working relationships with committees, and other functional tasks such as learning how to run the sound system and making sure we have adequate tech support.

Due to the uptick in responsibilities for Board members, we have decided to continue meeting throughout the Summer in hopes of having a smooth start to the church year come September. Speaking of Summer! Shay has compiled a list of links to virtual worship that can be attended since there is no organized offering of Summer services this year. And, while we are not planning formal worship, we do encourage informal opportunities to gather within this church community (see Informal Summer Gatherings blurb for more details) throughout the Summer.

We are thrilled to welcome Jan Sacco, Lisa Heustis, and Charlie Grindle to the Board as new members. Diane Whiteside-Peck and Karen Nelson finish their term on June 30th. We are so grateful for their years of contribution to this Board.


